Schaumburg Police Department releases Labor Day enforcement statistics

Schaumburg Police arrested (4) drivers for possession of cannabis and (1) driver on a felony possession of a controlled substance charge during the recent Labor Day “Driver Sober or Get Pulled Over” traffic safety campaign. Officers also issued (71) seat belt and (194) Distracted/Negligent Driving citations. This Labor Day traffic safety campaign was made possible by a federal traffic safety grant administered by the Illinois Department of Transportation.

“During the Labor Day effort officers continued to make the roads safe for residents, visitors, and those passing through Schaumburg. The officers focused on impaired driving, distracted driving, and seat belts use, regulations specific to decreasing potentially serious injury or fatal accidents,” said Chief Bill Wolf.

Enforcement during the campaign, which took place between August 15th and August 28th:
